We also know that it can be extremely difficult to navigate the various parental advice websites and keep up to date with the latest trends such as 'Fortnite'.

The Internet is an amazing tool for children. A great place to learn, play and be entertained however, we need to stay safe and alert! Here are a few tips and resources to help you guide your children and keep you up to date in the digital world.

Top Tips for Parents/Carers

- Know WHO your child is talking to, WHAT they're doing, and WHERE they're going online!
- Have ongoing conversations with your children about staying safe online.
- Check the sites that they are visiting and be aware of what the site allows i.e. chatting to other users online.
- Use safety tools like privacy settings on social networks and other online services.
- Use the parental controls on your home internet.
- Discuss together and create boundaries and rules for the amount of time your child can spend online.
- Share your technology rules with grandparents, babysitters and older siblings.
- Install Google Safe Search or use a child search engine such as Swiggle.org.uk
